Boucle

Derived from the French word “curled”, boucle fabric is named after the loop in its yarn. These loops have a fleece-like look and are frequently described as thick and nubby. Rapidly growing in popularity, its delicate and soft appearance makes it a popular upholstery option. Boucle fabric boasts a host of practical benefits, as its thick and durable material is soft to touch and has a lower absorption rate than other fabrics, making it more resilient to spills and wear. Boucle will maintain its colour and form for many years to come because of its resistance to piling.



Chenille

Often favoured for its unique aesthetic and comfort, chenille fabric offers versatility and texture. The distinctive pile of chenille is produced by wrapping small strands of yarn around a core. This produces an exceptionally soft-to-touch fabric that has a velvety feel. Durable and soft to touch, Chenille sofas need to be cared for to ensure their longevity. Simple precautions like routinely brushing your sofa with a soft brush can reduce the likelihood of light or dark patches forming, as chenille fabrics are prone to pile crush and darkening.



Velour/Velvet

The symbol of luxury, velvet sofas have a distinctive feel and aesthetic, largely owing to its short, dense pile that provides velvet its renowned plushness and sheen appearance. To maintain its opulent appearance, velvet sofas need to be maintained. Regular use of an upholstery brush will assist in minimising creases and maintaining the pile’s original appearance. It is recommended to place your velvet sofa away from direct sunshine because velvet can be prone to fading.
